Zoo siab tos txais! On behalf of the governing board and every member of Eternal Life Church, I want to extend a warm welcome to you. We have been praying for you and are very happy that you have now come.

Looking for a home church is challenging. It's similar to refugee resettlement. I was often asked, "Why do Hmong from tropical Laos come to make home in the frigid Minnesota?" My answer has always been: "The people climate is warm."



We hope you find the proper temperature here at ELC. We open our hearts to receive you just as Christ received you. Christ is the head of this church. As his body, we seek his will.

Our first priority is that you meet the Lord Jesus and receive him as your Lord and Savior. This meeting with Jesus is also called born again (John 1:12-13; 3:1-21). Salvation is a gift and you know when you receive it. Please tell us whether you have.

Second, we want you to grow as a disciple of Christ (John 15:1-8). Until we become fruitful disciples, Christianity is mere religion.

Third, we all are on this journey with Jesus (John 10:2-5, 14; 21:15-22). That means, we hear his call and follow.

My family came here to serve because of the call. When I was called from the practice of law to full time ministry in 1995, the Holy Spirit whispered this verse into my heart:

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead **(Phil 3:10-11)**.

This verse became the core of everything I do. Every aspect of my life can be explained through this verse.

Again, welcome to ELC.

When Alliance founder A. B. Simpson left a lucrative pastorate in New York City, he had a call from God to reach the lost masses both in New York and around the world.

Prostitutes, longshoremen, and the homeless received the reconciliation message that all people are eligible for Christ's amazing grace. He established the New York Gospel Tabernacle to bring likeminded people together into an organization that could facilitate outreach ministries.


He set up the Missionary Training Institute (MTI) to provide training and resources for men and women God was calling to take the gospel to the world. During that time, Simpson's group sent out the first team of missionaries to the Congo in 1884.

Since then, thousands of people have followed God's call to serve through The Alliance in the United States and abroad. In 1974, The Christian and Missionary (C&MA) officially became a denomination, but it still had at its core a heart for overseas missions. Past Alliance president Dr. L. L. King said of the C&MA that it "was not established as a mission divorced from the normal activity of a church, but a church which had within it the life and function of a mission.... The mission came first and the church grew out of a mission."

Today, the C&MA focuses on planting churches in the United States and overseas. Alliance international workers minister in 70 countries planting churches and training national church leaders, providing relief and development assistance, medical and dental care, and microenterprise projects. More than 2,000 churches in the U.S. minister Christ's love to their communities and cities.

History of The Christian and Missionary Alliance



A. B. Simpson

Albert Benjamin Simpson, founder of The Christian and Missionary Alliance was born December 15, 1843 in Bayview, Prince Edward Island, Canada. At an early age he felt the call of God on his life to preach and later experienced a dramatic conversion to faith in Jesus Christ.

FOURFOLD GOSPEL

Alliance founder Dr. A. B. Simpson defined the C&MA's spiritual DNA more than 100 years ago, referring to it as the Fourfold Gospel; it's the heart of what Alliance people believe about Jesus and forms the foundation of all that defines The Alliance movement.



The Fourfold Gospel is the Christological summary on which the core values of The Christian and Missionary Alliance is based. Through dramatic spiritual encounters that changed the course of his life, Simpson came to firmly believe

that Christ was not only his Savior, but also his Sanctifier and Healer.

Alliance people share this rich legacy, as well as our founder's passion to complete the Great Commission—to take the light of Christ to places where there is little access to the truth—and bring back our Coming King.



Jesus Christ is our Savior.

The Name of Jesus has impacted lives around the world for more than 2,000 years. He is a universal Savior, promising that: "whoever believes in him shall not perish but

have eternal life."

Jesus is an exclusive Savior. "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name in heaven given to men by which we must be saved" Acts 4:12. Contrary to what contemporary culture tells us, there are not multiple paths to God. There is only one—Jesus Christ



Jesus Christ is our Sanctifier.

Many Christians understand God's promise of salvation but do not experience the ongoing sanctifying work of Jesus Christ in their lives. For those who neither understand

nor allow the Holy Spirit's control in their lives, the results have a profound effect.

Unsuccessful struggle against sin and a lack of power in life and ministry frustrate those who have asked Jesus to be their Savior but not their Sanctifier, resulting in a lack of joy in their walk with Christ. At the point when we are born again, we become members of God's family. We believe He paid the price for our sin and that his followers are—set apart from those are not born again—and are seen as holy because of what Christ has done.



Jesus Christ is our Healer.

A great portion of Christ's time was dedicated to healing the sick. He healed all kinds of people: the blind, the paralyzed, the lame, the deaf, lepers, those who had fevers, and

many with chronic illnesses.

We find no record in the gospels of Jesus turning away anyone who came to him for healing, nor do we find that any disease was too difficult for him to heal. He even raised the dead. Miraculous healings still occur today—evidence that Christ is still our Healer.



Jesus Christ is our Coming King.

The physical return of Jesus has been the subject of speculation and controversy since His ascension into the clouds, which is recorded in the New Testament Book of Acts. Know-

ing that countless millions still have not heard the gospel, The Alliance is committed to doing its part to complete Christ's Great Commission before His imminent return.

There is one God,(1) who is infinitely perfect,(2) existing eternally in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.(3)

Jesus Christ is the true God and the true man.(4) He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.(5) He died upon the cross, the Just for the unjust,(6) as a substitutionary sacrifice,(7) and all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.(8) He arose from the dead according to the Scriptures.(9) He is now at the right hand of Majesty on high as our great High Priest.(10) He will come again to establish His kingdom, righteousness and peace.(11)

The Holy Spirit is a divine person, (12) sent to indwell, guide, teach, empower the believer, (13) and convince the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. (14)

The Old and New Testaments, inerrant as originally given, were verbally inspired by God and are a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men. They constitute the divine and only rule of Christian faith and practice. (15)

Man was originally created in the image and likeness of God:(16) he fell through disobedience, incurring thereby both physical and spiritual death. All men are born with a sinful nature,(17) are separated from the life of God, and can be saved only through the atoning work of the Lord Jesus Christ.(18) The portion of the unrepentant and unbelieving is existence forever in conscious torment;(19) and that of the believer, in everlasting joy and bliss.(20)

Salvation has been provided through Jesus Christ for all men; and those who repent and believe in Him are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God.(21)

It is the will of God that each believer should be filled with the Holy Spirit and be sanctified wholly,(22) being separated from sin and the world and fully dedicated to the will of God, thereby receiving power for holy living and effective service.(23) This is both a crisis and a progressive experience wrought in the life of the believer subsequent to conversion.(24)

Provision is made in the redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ for the healing of the mortal body.(25) Prayer for the sick and anointing with oil are taught in the Scriptures and are privileges for the Church in this present age.(26)

The Church consists of all those who believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, are redeemed through His blood, and are born again of the Holy Spirit. Christ is the Head of the Body, the Church, (27) which has been commissioned by Him to go into all the world as a witness, preaching the gospel to all nations. (28) The local church is a body of believers in Christ who are joined together for the worship of God, for edification through the Word of God, for prayer, fellowship, the proclamation of the gospel, and observance of the ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. (29)

There shall be a bodily resurrection of the just and of the unjust; for the former, a resurrection unto life;(30) for the latter, a resurrection unto judgment.(31)

The second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ is imminent(32) and will be personal, visible, and premillennial.(33) This is the believer's blessed hope and is a vital truth which is an incentive to holy living and faithful service.(34)




CHURCH HISTORY

In the beginning....

From our humble beginnings, Eternal Life Church (ELC) has strived to remain true to God's calling for us. We endeavored to remain steadfast in the face of adversity and to be willing to step out in faith and God has vastly blessed us for that. In looking back at our short history, we can clearly see that God was at work each step of the way. This gives us hope for the future and inspires us to continue to do work that will impact not only the Sacramento area but also the world.

On October 3, 2010, Eternal Life Church met together for the first time as a non-denominational church under the guidance of Pastor Mark Hitman. For the first two years, ELC met at the home of Mike and Kenberlynn Xiong and All Nations Seventh Day Adventist Church located in Elk Grove, CA until we were able to purchase our current Florin Road facility on October 8, 2012. Pastor Daniel Yang has shepherded the church since 2012.





Christian and Missionary Alliance Affiliation...

After much prayer and consideration, Eternal Life Church decided to align itself with the Christian and Missionary Alliance (CMA), a denomination focused on evangelizing and discipling persons throughout the United States, incorporating them into Christ-centered community-focused congregations, and mobilizing them for active involvement in a global effort designed to plant Great Commission churches among unengaged, unreached, and responsive peoples world-wide.

In March of 2011, Eternal Life Church was officially recognized as a church plant through CMA's Central Pacific District. As such, ELC has chosen to adopt March 2011 as its official Anniversary date. Through its growth, stability, and spiritual maturity of its congregation as evident by church attendance and tithing, Eternal Life Church was officially accredited an Alliance church through CMA's Central Pacific District on August 26, 2012.



Mission and Vision Statement

Eternal Life Church subscribes to the doctrinal statement of the Christian and Missionary Alliance, its Alliance Core Values, and its passion to complete the Great Commission. We believe that the local church is one of God's most powerful instruments to fulfill the Great Commission. Our Mission and Vision Statement speak to who we are as a local church and what we hope to accomplish for the kingdom of God.

Membership

The Governing Board of Eternal Life Church recognizes the fact that people will join the church before being baptized, and although these people will not have voting privileges and will not be asked to serve in any leadership capacity including leading ministries, teaching classes, life groups, etc., they too will be considered members. Eternal Life Church believes that the New Testament churches are made up of believers who are baptized in the Holy Spirit and are therefore united as one Body in Christ (1 Cor. 12:12-30). With is in mind, the primary duty of Eternal Life Church is to bring non-baptized members to a point where they will want to be baptized; and to teach and train baptized members to serve and to lead.

1 Corinthians 12:12-30

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

Unity and Diversity in the Body

12 For even as the body is one and yet has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ. 13 For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

14 For the body is not one member, but many. 15 If the foot says, "Because I am not a hand, I am not a part of the body," it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body. 16 And if the ear says, "Because I am not an eye, I am not a part of the body," it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body. 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? 18 But now God has placed the members, each one of them, in the body, just as He desired. 19 If they were all one member, where would the body be? 20 But now there are many members, but one body. 21 And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; or again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 On the contrary, it is much truer that the members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; 23 and those members of the body which we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor, and our less presentable members become much more presentable, 24 whereas our more presentable members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked, 25 so that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. 26 And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it.

27 Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it. 28 And God has appointed in the church, first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, various kinds of tongues. 29 All are not apostles, are they? All are not prophets, are they? All are not teachers, are they? All are not workers of miracles, are they? 30 All do not have gifts of healings, do they? All do not speak with tongues, do they? All do not interpret, do they?

Eternal Life Church Membership Application

Qualifications for membership shall consist of:

- 1. Confession of faith in Jesus Christ and evidence of regeneration.
- 2. Belief in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; in the verbal inspiration of the Holy Scriptures as originally given; in the vicarious atonement of the Lord Jesus Christ; in the eternal salvation of all who believe in Him and eternal punishment of all who reject Him.
- 3. Acceptance of the doctrines of the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior, Sanctifier, Healer, and Coming King.
- 4. Full sympathy with the principles and objectives of The Christian and Missionary Alliance and cooperation by systematic support of its work.
- 5. Such other qualifications for membership as may be stated in the Bylaws.
